• Michigan 4<sup>th</sup> Memorial Room

As part of Civil War Days at Gordon Hall, there will be the reenactment of the funeral and burial of local hero Col. Harrison H. Jeffords. He died on July 3, 1863 in the Wheatfield at Gettysburg, 150 years ago. The funeral will be held, Saturday, June 8<sup>th,</sup> at 9:00am at Forest Lawn Cemetery (Grand and Broad St) and will be conducted by members of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. All are welcome to attend. As an extension of the funeral, the staff of the Dexter Area Museum will be decorating the south room in Gordon Hall to honor those heroes from Dexter who served in the Civil War. The display will feature items acquired by a local collector that had belonged to Col. Harrison H. Jeffords, as well as, other historic artifacts. We will be sharing the genealogical information we have found on a number of Dexter soldiers who served in Company K of the 4<sup>th</sup> Michigan Infantry. Also included will be the burial information for those soldiers who died during or after the war, showing local cemetery information regarding burial sites of our heroes.

This will be a one-time display of these items, so follow the signs to the South entrance of Gordon Hall.

### **Sugar Cookie**

- 1 cup butter or margarine, softened
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 5 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup milk

#### Directions

In a mixing bowl, cream butter and sugar. Add eggs and vanilla. Combine flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt; add to creamed mixture alternately with the milk. Cover and refrigerate for 15 to 30 minutes. On a floured surface, roll out dough to 1/8-in. thickness. Cut out cookies into desired shapes (small round) and place 2 in. apart on a greased baking sheet. Bake at 350 degrees F for 10 minutes or until edges are lightly browned.

# **Ginger Cookies**

- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 3/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1/4 cup molasses
- 1 egg
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/3 cup white sugar for decoration

## **Directions**

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C).

- In a large bowl, mix together the brown sugar, oil, molasses, and egg. Combine the flour, baking soda, salt, cloves, cinnamon, and ginger; stir into the molasses mixture. Roll dough into 1 inch balls. Roll each ball in white sugar before placing 2 inches apart on ungreased cookie sheets.
- 2. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes in preheated oven, or until center is firm. Cool on wire racks.

## **Lemon Sugar Cookie**

- 1 cup <u>butter</u> or margarine, softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 tablespoon milk
- 2 teaspoons lemon extract
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- Additional sugar

In a mixing bowl, cream butter, shortening and sugar. Beat in egg, milk and extracts. Combine the flour, salt and baking soda; gradually add to creamed mixture. Shape into 3/4 in. balls 2 in. apart onto ungreased baking sheets. Flatten with a glass dipped in sugar. Bake at 400 degrees F for 9-11 minutes or until edges are lightly browned. Immediately remove to wire racks to cool.

# **Raspberry Almond Shortbread**

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 2/3 cup white sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon almond extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup seedless raspberry jam
- 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar
- 3/4 teaspoon almond extract
- 1 teaspoon milk

## **Directions**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F

In a medium bowl, cream together butter and white sugar until smooth. Mix in 1/2 teaspoon almond extract. Mix in flour until dough comes together. Roll dough into 1 1/2 inch balls, and place on ungreased cookie sheets. Make a small hole in the center of each ball, using your thumb and finger, and fill the hole with preserves.

Bake for 14 to 18 minutes in preheated oven, or until lightly browned. Let cool 1 minute on the cookie sheet.

In a medium bowl, mix together the confectioners' sugar, 3/4 teaspoon almond extract, and milk until smooth. Drizzle lightly over warm cookies
