DEXTER CENTENNIAL BUSINESSES

We have a number of Centennial Farms in the area which are farms that have been in the same family for 100 years or longer. Dexter also has a number of businesses that have been in the same location for 100 years or nearly 100 years. Currently the Dexter Area Museum is featuring two of these businesses: LaRosa's Confectionary and the Dexter Cooperative.

LaRosa's to The Red Brick



Joe LaRosa was born in 1897 in Sicily and came to the United States at age 15. Joe opened the LaRosa Confectionery with a partner on March 21, 1921 renting a space at 8093 Main Street from Daniel Hoey. By 1925 Joe was the sole owner of the business and the building. He was married to local girl Susan Marshall in February of 1925 and all of Joe and Suz's children worked in the store as well as Suz's sisters Betty Steinaway and Amy Sortor and many other family members.

The building at 80995. Main Street was built in 1869 following a destructive fire along this block of stores. It was occupied for some time by various drug stores. Since Joe began the confectionery in 1921, this site has continued to be a restaurant. In 1993 a fire caused considerable damage to the building next door and to this building as well. Following the fire it was completely renovated.

LaRosa's was a place where you could buy a hamburger, the kids could have an ice cream soda, and following the repeal of prohibition in 1933, Dad could enjoy a beer. It was the place where teens would hang out after school or sports events to wait for a ride home. All customers were well treated. LaRosa's operated until 1974 when the business and building were sold and became The Captain's Table. Some of the other restaurants that operated at this location were Second Cousins, Loreen's Village Café, Mary T's, and currently Red Brick.

The Dexter Agriculture Association was organized in November of 1919 for the purpose of eliminating the middleman who they felt charged high prices for farm supplies, but were underpaid for purchasing their grain, produce and livestock. Each farmer put up \$50, a considerable some in 1919, and signed a note for an additional \$50 to fund the association.

The association bought an old house and five lots on a triangle of land bordered by what currently is Central Street, Third Street and the railroad tracks. The old house on the

property was converted into a feed production facility where oats and corn, brought to the mill by local farmers, was ground in the basement. Upstairs, employees shelled corn and produced feed for hogs, chickens The new building started in 1940 and cows. They opened for business on January 1, 1920.



In March of 1927 the association became a stock company and changed the name to the Dexter Co-op Company. The Co-op did well even during the depression and started to outgrow their facilities. In 1940 they broke ground on a new building. The new building gave them room to stock more agricultural supplies as well as hardware, dishes and kitchen cabinets. In 1949 a fire destroyed the wooden grain elevator. A new fire resistant elevator was built where the old house had stood.



The Dexter Mill Today

In 1969, due to a decline in family agriculture in the area, the business was sold to Ray McCalla and renamed the Washtenaw Farm and Garden Center. They sold feed, farming supplies, fencing and gates, lawn and garden products, fertilizer and insecticides.

In 1979 Washtenaw Farm and Garden was sold and the name changed to The Dexter Mill. By 1980 the land contract on the property was payed off and the Co-op met for the last time to close the books

and pay off the share holders. At first the Dexter Mill was owned by Bill Millar, Chuck and John Cares and at some point the Cares' bought out Millar. The business was expanded to include a greenhouse in 2008. Today the business is owned by Keri Bushaw and the property by the Cares.


